#### Who We Are

Bilingual Learning Center is an amazing enrichment program that is uniquely designed to meet the needs of students and parents alike through before and after school programming, serving students in PreK through 5th grade.

Our program works with students from Minneapolis schools and supports language learning outside of the classroom.

BLC is a fully bilingual program (Spanish-English) designed to foster a welcoming, multicultural, nurturing and fun environment, and promotes a love for languages, cultural experiences, successful academics and leadership opportunities for our students.

BLC's core values are a welcoming environment, equity, responsibility and caring.

Our program goals are to decrease the achievement gap within a dual language immersion setting and to encourage the exploration of interests and the development of skills and creativity.

We support the needs of working families bringing awareness and recognition to their many different cultural backgrounds and traditions. BLC provides bilingual (Spanish-English) and bicultural before and after school care to students in PreK through 5th grade, as well as diverse classes, tutoring, and educational summer day camps.

The enrichment care program includes exposure to Spanish and English from our staff, indoor and outdoor games and activities, snacks, art projects, and more.

BLC offers a wide range of after school classes weekly on a seasonal basis. Our class offerings, which vary over the fall, winter, and spring sessions, have included Mexican dance, arts and crafts, cultural cooking class, beginning guitar, chess club, karate, and science and nature.

During the summer, BLC offers weekly day camps that provide exploration in multiple areas, from reading to Latino culture and art to math and science.

BLC's tutoring program is run in collaboration with the students' classroom teachers to work on specific areas of study in order to promote academic success.

#### **Windom Community School**

Since 2010, BLC has provided after school programs to the students of Windom School. Our presence in the school has adapted to major changes over the years, specifically the change from a dual immersion school to a community school in 2021 and the change in bell time which precipitated the opening of our before school program at this site.

## **Nokomis Heights Lutheran Church**

BLC opened our Nokomis site in 2021 during the end of the pandemic, and we are thrilled to continue our partnership with Nokomis Heights Lutheran Church.

BLC at Nokomis Heights is a satellite location serving students from Emerson, Green Central, and other Minneapolis schools. Students ride the bus to and from our location on MPS buses or are met at nearby schools by our staff.

#### **One-on-One Tutoring Program**

Tutoring is offered from mid-October through the end of the school year at our two main program sites, Windom and Nokomis. Students are recommended by parents and teachers following the fall conferences, and we arrange tutoring sessions with their goals in mind. Tutoring is available in English or Spanish in the subjects of math or reading/writing/speaking. Our tutors include college students and licensed teachers, volunteers and paid staff.

## **Summer Day Camps**

BLC summer day camps combine learning and recreation with a relaxed bilingual environment.
Students who attend our week-long day camps are from multiple schools around the metro, many of whom we only see during the summer months.



Each week has a different theme and a field trip. The 2023 camps took place at our Nokomis site, where they were also last year.

#### **Risen Christ Catholic School**

Following a successful partnership with Risen Christ from 2016–2019, we were happy to be asked back in 2022 to reopen our before school program at the school. The program is funded in part by RCCS and is attended by 95% Latine students.

#### **Minnehaha Academy**

This past year, we were part of a pilot program at Minnehaha to offer multi-ethnic after school enrichment classes throughout the year. BLC staff taught Spanish language and cultural classes twice a week during the months of September and February, and we have been asked to return this year to provide year-round Spanish classes.

# **Scholarships**


